CALL FOR APPLICATIONS: ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-2021**THE FULBRIGHT CHAIR ON GLOBAL CITIES AT
THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK**

The **Fulbright Chair on Global Cities at The City University of New York (CUNY)** will give one award for a Brazilian scholar to spend one academic term lecturing and researching in the fall term 2020 or spring term 2021, in accordance with CUNY's academic year calendar.

The Chair recognizes senior faculty and researchers who have established a record of teaching and exhibit the potential to make significant contributions to research in a field and on topics with applications to **the challenges facing Global Cities, such as social policy, public health, transportation, education, environmental resiliency and urban planning**. This program will strengthen cooperation between Brazilian and CUNY institutions addressing the challenges facing Global Cities, thus laying a foundation for scientific advancement and broadening students' knowledge in the field. The research produced through this cooperation should be appropriate for eventual policy application.

The thematic focus will be governance, which we understand broadly to include formal governmental processes, the role of non-governmental organizations in policy development and service delivery, non-institutional influences on governance (e.g., social media campaigns, loosely structured movements such as France's "yellow vests," etc.), and civil society more generally. The grantee will receive full funding for one academic term to support teaching and research activities in the Marxe School of Public and International Affairs at Baruch College of the City University of New York (CUNY). The mission of the Marxe School is "to empower the next generation of public and nonprofit leaders, advance knowledge about public life and policy, and engage communities across our city, nation, and world to foster effective, inclusive institutions and societies." The Chair will teach one course for graduate or advanced undergraduate students, conduct and share his or her research at our weekly faculty research seminar and in other appropriate venues. Though stationed in the Marxe School, the Visiting Professor is encouraged to interact with faculty across the campus and throughout CUNY.

1. ELIGIBILITY

The candidates must work under a full-time and active contract in a Brazilian higher education institution. English language proficiency compatible with the proposed activities is a requirement. The candidates must hold a Brazilian passport and must have earned the doctoral degree before December 31st, 2011. Candidates that have benefited of J-1 visa in the past must have returned to Brazil before August 1st 2018 in order to be eligible to the Fulbright Program. **Dual Brazilian/U.S. citizens and/or candidates hired on a temporary basis or as substitute professors are not eligible.**

The candidate must demonstrate outstanding academic qualification and a record of professional experience along with intellectual production in the proposed area during the last ten years in the Brazilian arena. The candidate must stay in Brazil during the selection, affiliation and depart to the U.S.; this grant cannot be cumulated with any other similar grant with the same purpose.

2. FUNDING

The Chair will award funding for one visiting scholar based on a four-month period, as follows:

- US\$ 38,400, for maintenance, housing and international round-trip air ticket. The award will be paid by both institutions in an equal amount of US\$ 19,200. The income paid by the university is subject to tax, determined under tax accounting rules;
- Limited health coverage through ASPE - Accident and Sickness Program for Exchanges;
- Visa J-1;

- Access to the facilities and services of CUNY, such as office space, laboratories, libraries and any other amenities regularly provided to the academic community to ensure the success of the teaching and research activities undertaken by the scholar.

3. SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The candidate must submit the online application form, available at <https://apply.iie.org/fvsp2020> indicating “**Chair on Global Cities at CUNY**” in the *Country Information*, cycle **2020-2021**, and including the following documents, **all in English**:

- Brazilian passport ID pages, pages, if available, or photo ID. If the candidate has already received a J-1 visa, copy of the DS-2019 form and of the visa page from the passport;
- Resume (CV), no more than three pages;
- PhD certificate or diploma (can be in Portuguese);
- Pay Stub (*contracheque*);
- Research project statement with bibliography;
- Plan of activities and syllabus of the proposed course; and
- Two letters of reference.

4. SELECTION PROCESS

The Fulbright Commission will review all applications and select the complete ones from eligible candidates. A peer review panel, nominated by the Fulbright Commission, will assess candidates’ academic and professional qualifications and the relevance of their proposed courses and research projects. An interview may be required.

The Fulbright Commission will nominate the selected candidate for final approval by the *J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board*. Preference will be given to candidates with no significant previous academic experience in the U.S.. Priority will be given for groups already underrepresented in the program.

5. TIMELINE

- **July 28th, 2019**: deadline for online applications submission;
- **October 2019**: results of the selection process;
- **Fall 2020 or spring 2021**: activities at CUNY.
