

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS – CYCLE 2022-2023
PROGRAM FOR BRAZILIAN CITIZENS
DOCTORAL DISSERTATION RESEARCH AWARD (DDRA)

On the 75th anniversary of the Fulbright Program, the Fulbright Commission is pleased to launch the call for applications for the **Doctoral Dissertation Research Award (DDRA)**. This award is part of the Fulbright Program, which aims to promote mutual understanding between peoples from the United States and other countries.

The Commission will offer up to **forty (40) awards** in open competition for Brazilian citizens currently enrolled in doctoral programs at Brazilian universities to develop part of their dissertation in the U.S. The DDRA provides opportunities to doctoral candidates to engage in nine-month dissertation research in the U.S. The award is for one academic year, beginning in **August/September 2022** and ending in **April/May 2023**.

1. ELIGIBILITY AND ENGLISH REQUIREMENTS

Candidates must be regular students enrolled at a Brazilian Ph.D. program and meet the English language requirements indicated below. Only Brazilian citizens are eligible, and dual Brazilian/U.S. citizens are not. The candidate must stay in Brazil during the selection and affiliation process and before departure to the U.S.

The minimum language requirement to apply to the DDRA program is assessed through standardized test scores obtained after **July 27th, 2020**: no less than 71 TOEFL iBT, 527 TOEFL ITP, 6.0 IELTS or 100 Duolingo.

The Commission, at its own discretion and expenses, can offer Pre-Academic English Language Programs to nominees with scores ranging from 71 to 79 (TOEFL iBT); 527 to 550 (TOEFL ITP); 6.0 to 7.0 (IELTS), 100 to 105 (Duolingo).

2. FUNDING

The Commission will fund for nine months:

- Monthly Stipend: living expenses, exclusively for the awardee, variable with the host institution campus;
- International air ticket;
- Settle-in allowance: US\$ 2,000;
- Financial support to participate in academic events in the U.S, upon prior approval: up to US\$ 1,000;
- If applicable, Pre-Academic English Language Program: Short or long-term English language course in the U.S.; mandatory for the awardees selected to participate by the Fulbright Commission according to proficiency level, host institution, and research field;
- Orientation seminar;
- Limited health insurance coverage: ASPE - Accident and Sickness Program for Exchanges; and; and
- J-1 visa fee.

3. SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The candidate must carefully read the Application Instructions and submit the online application form, both available at www.fulbright.org.br, including all the following mandatory supporting documents:

- **Brazilian passport ID pages**, if available, or official ID document with photo (ex. RG or CNH);
- **Personal Statement in English**, one page;
- **Study/Research Objective in English** – candidates must send a research project with up to ten pages, not including the Bibliography. It must include the following items: (i) Title, Background, and Relevance; (ii) Objectives; (iii) Methodology; (iv) Timetable; (v) U.S. host institution (indicate and justify the U.S. host institution you will attend – must be the same from the Invitation letter) and Bibliography;
- **Academic transcripts**: applicants must submit official, complete, and certified diplomas and transcripts in Portuguese of the undergraduate program, master's degree, and the current doctorate program indicating the date of enrollment;
- **Previous DS-2019 forms and J-1 visas** on the passport if the candidate has already received a J-1 visa;
- **CV in English**, no more than three pages;
- **Brazilian academic advisor's CV in English** limited to four pages;
- **TOEFL or IELTS score report**;
- **Letter of support** from the home institution;

- **Invitation letter** from a U.S. university;
- **Three letters of reference in English.**

Applicants must also record a **thirty-seconds video in English** and send it through the Fulbright Brazil Platform. In the video, applicants must explain **why going to the U.S. is vital to the candidate's doctoral dissertation.**

Candidates must submit their applications through the online application system and send the video until the deadline, **August 1st, 2021.** The Fulbright Commission will not consider applications with inaccurate, insufficient, or inconsistent data or missing supporting documents and video.

4. SELECTION PROCESS

The Fulbright Commission will review and select the valid applications. A peer review panel, nominated by the Commission, will assess candidates' academic and professional qualifications and the relevance of their applications. An interview will be required by videoconference or phone. Priority will be given for all qualified individuals belonging underrepresented groups.

The Fulbright Commission will nominate the pre-selected candidate for approval by the J. William Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board (FFSB).

Note: Plagiarism will result in disqualification from participating in the program.

5. TIMETABLE

- **August 1st, 2021:** deadline for submitting applications
- **October 2021:** interview of candidates approved by the review panel
- **October 2021:** announcement of selected candidates
- **August/September 2022:** start of activities in the U.S.

6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Grantees will be required to complete their Fulbright grant in the academic program specified in the grant document. Grant dates and funding amounts stated in the grant document are subject to change. Prospective Fulbright participants should be aware that public health conditions, availability of consular services and travel, as well as U.S. institutional operating status and policies may affect their ability to travel to the U.S. and participate in academic programs. The grant is activated only if the grantee can obtain a passport, J-1 visa and enter the United States to start the academic program outlined in the grant document.
